Long Ledge is a great dive site at St Helena, being a natural beauty under the sea. It has very defining features which is why this has been left untouched by trail markers. In order to do this nature trail, **you must be accompanied by a local diver.**

Below are some of the interesting marine life that you could see throughout the dive. Enjoy!

Fish to be seen:

**Bastard Cavalley Pilot, Bastard Cunningfish, Bastard Fivefinger, Bastard Hogfish, Brim, Bullseye, Cavalley, Conger, Cunningfish, Fivefinger, Grannyfish, Greenfish Grouper, Gurnard, Hardback Soldier, Hogfish, Marmalade Razorfish, Old Wife, Parrotfish, Rockfish, Rockspear, Sand Greenfish, Soapfish, Shitty Trooper, Softback Soldiers, Trantran, Cavalley Pilot.**

Other possible fish to be seen:

**Blackfish, Moray eels with cleaner shrimp at end of ledge**

Other marine life:

**Algae - various kinds, Anemones, Barnacles, Clams, Feather stars, Fire Hydroid, Golden cup coral, Sea cucumber, Sea urchins, Star fish, Tunicate worm, Whip coral**

Other possible:

**Manta Ray, Turtle - green or hawksbill**

Other features:

**At ledge end: island formation, Caves, Great stone work.**

**Near edge of ledge = step formation, Rocky areas, Sandy areas**
