



Direct flights from Cape Town: Dec 2024 to March 2025

Cape Town flights will be re-introduced in December 2024 and will run until March 2025.

St Helena's weekly Saturday return flight will operate from Cape Town and the weekly Tuesday return will operate from Johannesburg.

These twice-weekly Airlink flights give travellers greater flexibility in length of stay and route of travel, and provide great opportunity for dual-centre holidays to enjoy both Cape Town and St Helena.

The flights are scheduled during St Helena's summer months, when activities like hiking, diving, and swimming with whale sharks are at their finest.

At the end of the Festival of Walking a presentation ceremony will take place where prizes will be awarded based on how many walks each participant has completed. A commemorative certificate for completing all the Post Box Walks will also be available. Memorabilia can also be purchased from local souvenir shops throughout the festival.

We're offically a Hope Spot

In November 2023, St Helena announced that Mission Blue officially recognised St Helena's Category VI Marine Protected Area (MPA) as

a <u>Hope Spot</u>. This significant environmental milestone celebrates the island's 20-year journey and commitment to understanding and protecting the island's marine

environment.

St Helena's 450,000km2 MPA joins an ocean network of 156 Hope Spots around the world. St Helena's globally significant and pristine marine environment is full of biodiversity, even hosting migratory species like whale sharks, humpback whales and tuna. The local community is deeply connected to its ocean, with traditions like sailing, swimming and fishing embedded into our history, culture and traditions. Being recognised as a Hope Spot not only celebrates St Helena's environmental achievements but also puts the island on the map as an outstanding destination for sustainable marine tourism.
